

## Entry regulations for Switzerland

As of Saturday, 4 December, all countries have been removed from the current Swiss quarantine list. The following entry requirements apply:

In order to continue to prevent the new Omicron variant from entering the country as far as possible, a stricter testing regime will now apply for all arrivals into Switzerland. This testing requirement also applies to those who have been vaccinated or have recovered from the disease. In addition to taking a PCR test before travelling, a second test (PCR test or rapid antigen test) must be carried out between the fourth and seventh day after arrival. Test costs must be borne by the traveler.

This means that people who enter Switzerland on 6 December with a negative test and leave on 12 December after Davos Nordic do not have to take any additional tests (concerns entry regulations). If the stay in Switzerland is longer, a test must be carried out.

The negative PCR tests are valid for 72 hours. This validity must be observed when picking up the accreditation, as the FIS Passport stipulates that a negative PCR test result must be available for the issuing of the accreditation for Davos Nordic.

In addition, it is mandatory to fill out an entry form (Swiss PLF) for entering Switzerland. The applicable Swiss protection measures must also be complied with. Further Information:
